Theme: Care for Trees – Trees Care for You

Eligible Participants: Arizona youth, grades K-12. Posters will be judged based on grade level, and prizes will be awarded to the top three posters in each group (K-2, 3-4, 5-8, 9-12).

Poster Size: Maximum of 12” x 16”; there is no minimum size. Only one (1) poster may be submitted per participant.

- Posters will be judged on originality, design, slogan, artwork, and connection to the care of trees. Any slogans should be clear, brief, and positive.
- Artwork should be original and wording may be computer-generated or hand-written. Organization/agency logos and copyright characters may not be used. Posters become the property of Arizona State Forestry and will not be returned. Posters may be used for publicity purposes.
- In order to be eligible, the following information must be attached to the back of the poster: Participant’s name, grade, age, school, school phone number, school address, teacher’s name, teacher’s email.
- Parents and teachers are encouraged to do their own research on caring for trees and share their findings with the youth participating in the poster contest.
